ADVENT

Sunday, November 28, 1819

First Sunday in Advent

Introit: *Ad Te Levavi* — Psalm 25:1–3, 5

UNTO Thee, O Lord, do I lift up my soul: O my God, I trust in Thee. Let me not be ashamed: let not mine enemies triumph over me. Yea, let none that wait on Thee: be ashamed. Psalm. Show me Thy ways, O Lord: teach me Thy paths.

Collect: *Stir up, we beseech Thee, Thy power, O Lord, and come; that by Thy protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins, and saved by Thy mighty deliverance; Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *ALL they that wait for Thee: shall not be ashamed, O Lord. Verse. Show me Thy ways, O Lord: teach me Thy paths. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Show us Thy mercy, O Lord: and grant us Thy salvation. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Jeremiah 23:5-8 · Psalm: Psalm 24 (antiphon: v. 7) · Epistle: Romans 13:(8-10) 11-14 · Gospel: Matthew 21:1-9

Sunday, December 5, 1819

Second Sunday in Advent

Introit: *Populus Sion* — Isaiah 30:30; Psalm 80:1

DAUGHTER of Zion: behold thy salvation cometh. The Lord shall cause His glorious voice to be heard: and ye shall have gladness of heart. Psalm. Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel: Thou that leadest Joseph like a flock.

Collect: *Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to make ready the way of Thine Only-begotten Son, so that by His coming we may be enabled to serve Thee with pure minds; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *OUT of Zion the perfection of beauty God hath shined: Our God shall come. V. Gather My saints together unto Me: those that have made a covenant with Me by sacrifice. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. I was glad when they said unto me: Let us go into the house of the Lord. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Our feet shall stand within thy gates: O Jerusalem. Hallelujah.*

Sunday, December 12, 1819

Third Sunday in Advent

Introit: *Gaudete* — Philippians 4:4–5; Psalm 85:1

REJOICE in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice. Let your moderation be known unto all men: the Lord is at hand. Be careful for nothing: but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. Psalm. Lord, Thou hast been favorable unto Thy land: Thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob.

Collect: *Lord, we beseech Thee, give ear to our prayers, and lighten the darkness of our hearts by Thy gracious visitation; Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THOU that dwellest between the Cherubim, shine forth: Stir up Thy strength and come. Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel: Thou that leadest Joseph like a flock. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Stir up Thy strength: and come and save us. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-8 (9-11) · Psalm: Psalm 85 (antiphon: v. 9) · Epistle: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5 · Gospel: Matthew 11:2-10 (11)

Sunday, December 19, 1819

Fourth Sunday in Advent

Introit: *Rorate Caeli* — Isaiah 45:8; Psalm 19:1

DROP down, ye heavens, from above: and let the skies pour down righteousness. Let the earth open: and bring forth salvation. Psalm. The heavens declare the glory of God: and the firmament showeth His handiwork.

Collect: *Stir up, O Lord, we beseech Thee, Thy power, and come, and with great might succor us, that by the help of Thy grace whatsoever is hindered by our sin may be speedily accomplished, through Thy mercy and satisfaction; Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THE Lord is nigh unto all them that call upon Him: to all that call upon Him in truth. My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord: and let all flesh bless His Holy Name. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Thou art my Help and my Deliverer: make no tarrying, my God. Hallelujah.*

CHRISTMAS

Friday, December 24, 1819

The Nativity of Our Lord (Christmas Eve)

Introit: *Hodie Sciētis* — Exodus 16:6-7; Psalm 96:1

Collect: *O God, Who hast made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of the true Light: Grant, we beseech Thee, that as we have known on earth the mysteries of that Light, we may also come to the fullness of His joys in heaven; Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Readings: First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14 · Psalm: Psalm 110:1-4 (antiphon: v. 2a) · Epistle: 1 John 4:7-16 · Gospel: Matthew 1:18-25

Saturday, December 25, 1819

The Nativity of Our Lord (Day)

Introit: *Puer Natus Est* — Isaiah 9:6; Psalm 98:1

UNTO us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder. And His Name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The Mighty God: The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Psalm. O sing unto the Lord a new song: for He hath done marvelous things.

Collect: *Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that the new Birth of Thine Only-begotten Son in the flesh may set us free who are held in the old bondage under the yoke of sin; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *ALL the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God: Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all the earth. V. The Lord hath made known His salvation: His righteousness hath He openly showed in the sight of the heathen. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. O come, let us sing unto the Lord: Let us worship and bow down before Him. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Exodus 40:17-21, 34-38 · Psalm: Psalm 2 (antiphon: v. 7) · Epistle: Titus 3:4-7 · Gospel: John 1:1-14 (15-18)

Sunday, December 26, 1819

First Sunday after Christmas

Introit: *Dum Medium Silentium* — Wisdom 18:14-15; Psalm 93:1

THY testimonies are very sure: holiness becometh Thine house, O Lord, forever. Thy throne is established of old: Thou art from everlasting. Psalm. The Lord reigneth, He is clothed with majesty: the Lord is clothed with strength, wherewith He hath girded Himself.

Collect: *Almighty and Everlasting God, direct our actions according to Thy good pleasure, that in the Name of Thy beloved Son, we may be made to abound in good works; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Saturday, January 1, 1820

The Circumcision and Name of Jesus

Introit: *Nomen Iesu* — Philippians 2:10–11; Psalm 8:1

O LORD our Lord, how excellent is Thy Name in all the earth: Who hast set Thy glory above the heavens. What is man that Thou art mindful of him: and the son of man that Thou visitest him? Psalm. Thou, O Lord, art our Father, our Redeemer: Thy Name is from everlasting.

Collect: *O Lord God, Who, for our sakes, hast made Thy blessed Son our Saviour subject to the Law, and caused Him to endure the circumcision of the flesh: Grant us the true circumcision of the Spirit, that our hearts may be pure from all sinful desires and lusts; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *ALL the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God: Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all the earth. V. The Lord hath made known His salvation: His righteousness hath He openly showed in the sight of the heathen. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. God, Who of old time spake in divers ways unto the fathers by the prophets: hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Numbers 6:22-27 · Psalm: Psalm 8 (antiphon: v. 9) · Epistle: Galatians 3:23-29 · Gospel: Luke 2:21

Sunday, January 2, 1820

Second Sunday after Christmas

Introit: *Dum Medium Silentium* — Wisdom 18:14–15; Psalm 93:1

Thursday, January 6, 1820

The Epiphany of Our Lord

Introit: *Ecce Advenit* — Malachi 3:1; Psalm 72:1

BEHOLD the Lord, the Ruler, hath come: and the kingdom, and the power, and the glory are in His hand. Psalm. Give the King Thy judgments, O God: and Thy righteousness unto the King's Son.

Collect: *O God, Who by the leading of a star didst manifest Thy Only-begotten Son to the Gentiles: Mercifully grant, that we, who know Thee now by faith, may after this life have the fruition of Thy glorious Godhead; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *ALL they from Sheba shall come; they shall bring gold and incense: and they shall show forth the praises of the Lord. V. Arise, and shine, O Jerusalem: for the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. We have seen His star in the east: and we have come with our gifts to worship the Lord. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6 · Psalm: Psalm 24 (antiphon: v. 7) · Epistle: Ephesians 3:1-12 · Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Sunday, January 9, 1820

The Baptism of Our Lord

Introit: *In Excelso Throno* — Isaiah 6:1; Psalm 100:1–2

I SAW also the Lord, sitting upon a throne: high and lifted up. And I heard the voice of a great multitude, saying, Alleluia: for the Lord God Omnipotent reigneth. Psalm. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands: Serve the Lord with gladness.

Collect: *O Lord, we beseech Thee mercifully to receive the prayers of Thy people who call upon Thee; and grant that they may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfill the same; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *BLESSED be the Lord God, the God of Israel, Who only doeth wondrous things: And blessed be His glorious Name forever. The mountains shall bring peace to Thy people: and the hills righteousness. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands: Serve the Lord with gladness. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Joshua 3:1-3, 7-8, 13-17 or Isaiah 42:1-7 · Psalm: Psalm 85 (antiphon: v. 9) · Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 · Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17

Sunday, January 16, 1820

Second Sunday after the Epiphany

Introit: *Omnis Terra* — Psalm 66:1–2, 4

ALL the earth shall worship Thee: and shall sing unto Thee, O God. They shall sing to Thy Name: O Thou Most Highest. Psalm. Make a joyful noise unto God, all ye lands: sing forth the honor of His Name, make His praise glorious.

Collect: *Almighty and Everlasting God, Who dost govern all things in heaven and earth: Mercifully hear the supplications of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *HE sent His Word and healed them: and delivered them from their destructions. V. Oh that men would praise the Lord for His goodness: and for His wonderful works to the children of men. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Praise ye Him, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Exodus 33:12-23 or Amos 9:11-15 · Psalm: Psalm 67 (antiphon: v. 1) or Psalm 111 (antiphon: v. 9) · Epistle: Ephesians 5:22-33 or Romans 12:6-16 · Gospel: John 2:1-11

Sunday, January 23, 1820

The Transfiguration of Our Lord

Introit: *Illuxerunt* — Psalm 77:18; Psalm 84:1

THE lightnings lightened the world: the earth trembled and shook. Psalm. How amiable are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts: My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the Lord.

Collect: *O God, Who in the glorious Transfiguration of Thy Only-begotten Son, hast confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the testimony of the fathers, and Who, in the voice that came from the bright cloud, didst in a wonderful manner foreshow the adoption of sons: Mercifully vouchsafe to make us co-heirs with the King of His glory, and bring us to the enjoyment of the same; through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THOU art fairer than the children of men: grace is poured into Thy lips. V. The Lord said unto my Lord. Sit Thou at My right hand: until I make Thine enemies Thy footstool. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. V. Sing unto the Lord. bless His Name; show forth His salvation from day to day: Declare His glory among all people. Hallelujah.*

Readings: First Reading: Exodus 34:29-35 or Exodus 3:1-14 · Psalm: Psalm 2 (antiphon: v. 7) · Epistle: 2 Peter 1:16-21 · Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

PRE-LENT

Sunday, January 30, 1820

Septuagesima

Introit: *Circumdederunt Me* — Psalm 18:4–5; Psalm 18:1–2

THE sorrows of death compassed me: the sorrows of hell compassed me about. In my distress I called upon the Lord: and He heard my voice out of His temple. Psalm. I will love Thee, Lord my Strength: The Lord is my Rock and my Fortress.

Collect: *O Lord, we beseech Thee favorably to hear the prayers of Thy people: that we, who are justly punished for our offences, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness, for the glory of Thy Name; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THE Lord also will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble: And they that know Thy Name will put their trust in Thee; for Thou, Lord, hast not forsaken them that seek Thee. V. For the needy shall not always be forgotten: the expectation of the poor shall not perish forever. Arise, O Lord; let not man prevail. Tract. Out of the depths have I cried unto Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice.*

Readings: First Reading: Exodus 17:1-7 · Psalm: Psalm 95:1-9 (antiphon: v. 6) · Epistle: 1 Corinthians 9:24-10:5 · Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16

Sunday, February 6, 1820

Sexagesima

Introit: *Exsurge* — Psalm 44:23–24, 26; Psalm 44:1

AWAKE, why sleepest Thou, O Lord: arise, cast us not off for ever. Wherefore hidest Thou Thy face: and forgettest our affliction? Our soul is bowed down to the dust: arise for our help and redeem us. Psalm. We have heard with our ears, O God: our fathers have told us what work Thou didst in their days.

Collect: *O Lord God, Who seest that we put not our trust in anything that we do: Mercifully grant that by Thy power we may be defended against all adversity; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *LET the nations know that Thy Name is Jehovah: A Thou alone art the Most High over all the earth. My God, make them like a wheel: and like chaff before the wind. Tract. Thou hast given a banner to them that fear Thee: that it may be displayed because of the truth.*

Readings: First Reading: Isaiah 55:10-13 · Psalm: Psalm 84 (antiphon: v. 4) · Epistle: 2 Corinthians 11:19-12:9 or Hebrews 4:9-13 · Gospel: Luke 8:4-15

Sunday, February 13, 1820

Quinquagesima

Introit: *Esto Mihi* — Psalm 31:2–3; Psalm 31:1

BE Thou my strong Rock: for an house of defense to save me. Thou art my Rock and my Fortress: therefore for Thy Name's sake lead me and guide me. Psalm. In Thee, O Lord, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in Thy righteousness.

Collect: *O Lord, we beseech Thee mercifully hear our prayers, and, having set us free from the bonds of sin, defend us from all evil; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THOU art the God that doest wonders: Thou hast declared Thy strength among the peoples. V. Thou hast with Thine arm redeemed Thy people: the sons of Jacob and Joseph. Tract. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands: Serve the Lord with gladness.*

Readings: First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1-13 or Isaiah 35:3-7 · Psalm: Psalm 89:18-29 (antiphon: v. 20) or Psalm 146 (antiphon: v. 2) · Epistle: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 · Gospel: Luke 18:31-43

LENT

Wednesday, February 16, 1820

Ash Wednesday

Introit: *Miserere Mihi* — Psalm 57:1; Psalm 57:1

I WILL cry unto God Most High: unto God that performeth all things for me. Yea, in the shadow of Thy wings will I make my refuge I until these calamities be overpast. Psalm. Be merciful unto me, O God, be merciful unto me: for my soul trusteth in Thee.

Collect: *Almighty and Everlasting God, Who hatest nothing that Thou hast made, and dost forgive the sins of all those who are penitent: Create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins, and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of Thee, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *BE merciful unto me, God, be merciful unto me: for my soul trusteth in Thee. V. He shall send from heaven: and save me from the reproach of him that would swallow me up. Tract. O Lord, deal not with us after our sins; nor reward us according to our iniquities: Help us, O God of our salvation; for the glory of Thy Name.*

Readings: First Reading: Joel 2:12-19 or Jonah 3:1-10 · Psalm: Psalm 51:1-13 (14-19) (antiphon: v. 17) · Epistle: 2 Peter 1:2-11 · Gospel: Matthew 6:(1-6) 16-21

Sunday, February 20, 1820

First Sunday in Lent

Introit: *Invocavit* — Psalm 91:15–16; Psalm 91:1

HE shall call upon Me, and I will answer him: I will deliver him and honor him. With long life will I satisfy him: and show him My salvation. Psalm. He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High: shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

Collect: *O Lord, mercifully hear our prayer, and stretch forth the right hand of Thy Majesty to defend us from them that rise up against us; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *FOR He shall give His angels charge over thee: to keep thee in all thy ways. V. They shall bear thee up in their hands: lest thou dash thy foot against a stone Tract. He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High: shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.*

Readings: First Reading: Genesis 3:1-21 or 1 Samuel 17:40-51 · Psalm: Psalm 32 (antiphon: v. 7) or Psalm 118:1-13 (antiphon: v. 5) · Epistle: 2 Corinthians 6:1-10 or Hebrews 4:14-16 · Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11

Sunday, February 27, 1820

Second Sunday in Lent

Introit: *Reminiscere* — Psalm 25:6–7; Psalm 25:1–2

REMEMBER, O Lord, Thy tender mercies and Thy loving-kindnesses I for they have been ever of old. Let not mine enemies triumph over me: God of Israel, deliver us out of all our troubles. Psalm. Unto Thee, O Lord, do I lift up my soul: my God, I trust in Thee; let me not be ashamed.

Collect: *O God, Who seest that of ourselves we have no strength: Keep us both outwardly and inwardly; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *THE troubles of my heart are enlarged: bring Thou me out of my distresses. V. Look upon mine affliction and my pain: and forgive all my sins. Tract. give thanks unto the Lord; for He is good: for His mercy endureth forever.*

Readings: First Reading: Genesis 32:22-32 · Psalm: Psalm 121 (antiphon: vv. 1-2) · Epistle: 1 Thessalonians 4:1-7 or Romans 5:1-5 · Gospel: Matthew 15:21-28

Sunday, March 5, 1820

Third Sunday in Lent

Introit: *Oculi* — Psalm 25:15–16; Psalm 25:1

MINE eyes are ever toward the Lord: for He shall pluck my feet out of the net. Turn Thee unto me, and have mercy upon me: for I am desolate and afflicted. Psalm. Unto Thee, Lord, do I lift up my soul: my God, I trust in Thee; let me not be ashamed.

Collect: *We beseech Thee, Almighty God, look upon the hearty desires of Thy humble servants, and stretch forth the right hand of Thy Majesty to be our defence against all our enemies; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever One God, world without end. Amen.*

Gradual: *ARISE, O Lord; let not man prevail: let the heathen be judged in Thy sight, When mine enemies are turned back: they shall fall and perish at Thy presence. Tract. Unto Thee lift I up mine eyes, O Thou that dwellest in the heavens: Have mercy upon us, Lord, have mercy upon us.*

Readings: First Reading: Exodus 8:16-24 or Jeremiah 26:1-15 · Psalm: Psalm 136:1-16 (antiphon: v. 26) or Psalm 4 (antiphon: v. 8) · Epistle: Ephesians 5:1-9 · Gospel: Luke 11:14-28

Sunday, March 12, 1820

Fourth Sunday in Lent

Introit: *Laetare* — Isaiah 66:10–11; Psalm 122:1

REJOICE, ye with Jerusalem, and be glad with her: all ye that love her. Rejoice for joy with her: all ye that mourn for her. Psalm. I was glad when they said unto me: Let us go into the house of the Lord.
